The Spanish Community Care Association (SCCA) is a non-profit incorporated association, to meet the specific needs of disadvantaged, senior and isolated members of the Spanish speaking community within the Sydney metropolitan area through our direct support services.

Our direct support services are aimed at providing welfare assistance, mental health care and support to our clients with particular emphasis placed on those who may be disadvantaged due to age, physical and mental disability, language and communication barriers, isolated and/or lonely clients with limited access to social and welfare support. SCCA provides a range of quality support, information, referrals, programs and activities. We also connect people to government and other social services and advocate on their behalf in their own language.

These services are flexible in relation to our client's needs and circumstances and include home care visits and personal care services.



# PRESIDENT REPORT

We don't know when the pandemic will stop, but we know that it will end at some point. When everything is over, let's hope sooner rather than later, we will not be the same as before, but we will be stronger and have more energy than ever to face new challenges.


